### Teledentistry and the Changing Dental World

Has there been a shift in the dental industry? How have the economics changed? What are the new demographics? ### Infection Control Practice Hybrid

Online: Jan. 2-16  
Clinical: Jan. 16, 1-5 pm

With online and hands-on components, this course covers barrier techniques, limiting contamination, hand washing, handling of sharps, sterilization, disinfection, and disposal of waste materials. You will complete assignments online prior to the clinical portion. This course is not designed to meet annual OSHA training requirements and is not required for dental assistant graduates from ADA-accredited programs. **Cost: \$224**

### Preliminary Oral Inspection Hybrid

Online: Jan. 2-16  
Clinical: Jan. 16, 8:30am–12:30pm

This covers the Introduction to Dental Assisting in 302.06. With online and hands-on components, this course prepares dental assistants to perform a preliminary oral inspection on patients and includes taking medical/dental histories, obtaining/reading vital signs, basic oral anatomy and terminology, and dental charting. Participants must complete assignments online prior to the clinical portion. **Cost: \$224**

### Infection Control for the Dental Office

Online: Jan. 11-22

This course provides infection control guidelines and recommendations for the dental office. It is based on the CDC infection and prevention guidelines and includes information on disinfection and sterilization, products, and asepsis protocols. This course fulfills the N.H. dental infection control requirements for certification and license renewal. **Cost: \$129**

## Medical Management in Public Health Dental Settings

Online: Jan. 23; 9 am-4 pm

This course addresses systemic conditions and diseases with emphasis on dental hygiene treatment planning, the management of dental and medical emergencies in alternative dental settings, and a pharmacology review for common disease states. It includes an update on the “new normal” for infection control procedures and preprocedural mouth rinses. **Cost: \$249**

## Dental Sealants Hybrid

Online: Feb. 6-27

Clinical: Feb. 27; 8:30 am-2:30pm

This course’s lecture and clinical sessions provide an in-depth study of dental sealants. You’ll be qualified to legally apply sealants in N.H. and will need to provide a patient requiring sealants on at least four occlusal surfaces; patients under 12 need instructor approval. You’ll work on extracted, sterile teeth. **Cost: \$297**

## Dental Office Emergencies – Is Your Team Prepared?

This course’s lecture and practice drills focus on the prevention and management of medical emergencies in the dental office. We cover common systemic conditions, etiologies of disease, and risk assessment. **Cost: \$120**

## EFDA Certification Program

Online: Feb.15

Clinical: March 7-May 9; 8 am-5 pm

Intensive: March 16-19; 8 am-5 pm

Clinical Externship: 120 hours

The EFDA certification qualifies certified dental assistants and hygienists to place, contour, and adjust the materials used in restorative procedures, following the removal of decay by the dentist. After completing NHTI’s 270-hour training program, you must register with the N.H. Board of Dental Examiners, work under the direct supervision of a licensed N.H. dentist, and complete the required annual continuing education coursework. **Cost: \$7,500**

## Evidence-Based Dentistry for Dental Professionals

The course covers how to conduct online searches to find the best evidence to answer clinical questions and discover implementation to design, deliver, and appraise dental public health programs. During the course, you’ll be required to conduct guided online searches and to report on your findings. **Cost: \$199**

This hands-on course qualifies the orthodontic dental assistant to perform expanded orthodontic duties designated by the N.H. Board of Dental Examiners. **Cost: \$265**

## Monitoring Nitrous Oxide Use (Hybrid)

This course prepares dental assistants and dental hygienists to monitor nitrous oxide use during dental procedures. Upon successful completion of the course, you’ll meet the qualifications stipulated by the N.H. Board of Dental Examiners. **Cost: \$244**

## Techniques in Dental Radiology

Online: April 26-June 19

Clinical: May 8, May 22, June 5,

June 19; 8:30 am-5:30 pm

This course features online lectures and learning activities coordinated with lab practice to develop dental radiographic techniques. You are required to schedule two clients. Techniques covered include digital radiography, processing, mounting and evaluating films. Emphasis placed on client and operator protection, exposure and processing errors, asepsis protocol, radiographic techniques and equipment function. Following this course, passing of RHS portion of DANB exam is required according to N.H. law. **Cost: \$1195**
