
 To promote optimal oral health for the people of New Hampshire through access to integrated and comprehensive health services

Oral Health 2014 Guiding Principles




- Engage a broader constituency to improve oral health: diversity of opinion leads to better decisions and actions
- See the whole: six priority areas (Alliance) link individual grantee efforts to create something bigger
- Implement solutions based on what we know/have already (e.g. grantees focused on medical/dental collaboration partnering with the NIIOH and using Smiles for Life tool): don't reinvent the wheel
- Draw from and contribute to this national network: grantees
 leverage TA providers and learning from individual efforts for greater impact
- Engage organizations that represent the interests of those impacted by grantee activities
- Use processes that respect the legitimacy of every party's interests
- Align program with the Oral Health 2014 theory of change
- Participate in evaluation: balance accountability and learning



Oral Health 2014 Theory of Change



Normative Underpinnings

Values

- Integrity and transparency
- Respectful relationships
- Creativity and innovation

Core Principles

- Trust-building
- Diverse and effective partnerships
- Shared leadership without expectations of ownership

Normative Underpinnings...

- Blame Free: does not matter who is to blame for problem – focus on "how it gets fixed."
- Gossip Free talk to people in the room, not about them.

Colloquium
