#### **PROGRAM LEARNING OBJECTIVES**

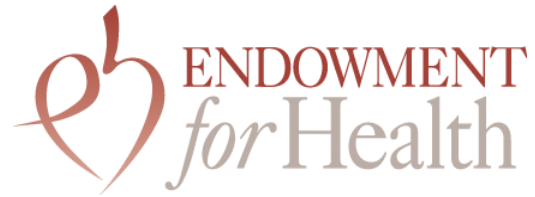
